EMBODIED PRESENCE: PATHWAYS TO AN AUTHENTIC SELF (SUMMER 2026)



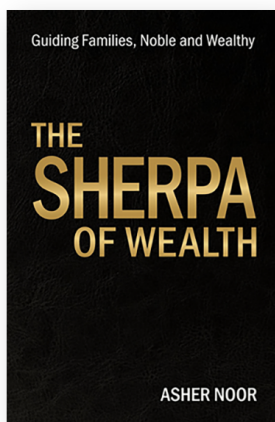
