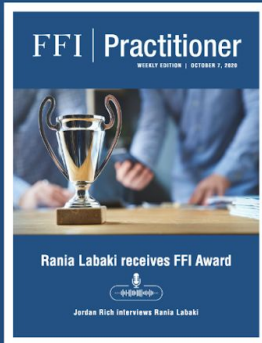

# Rania Labaki receives FFI Award

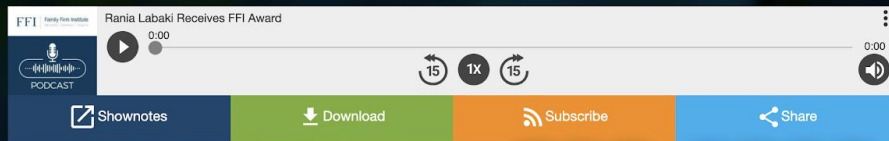

### RANIA LABAKI, PHD

**Rania Labaki, PhD**, FFI Fellow, is an associate professor of management at EDHEC Business School and director of the EDHEC Family Business Centre. Her interest ranges from finance in family firms to the play of emotions in family relationships, particularly as emotional patterns are passed through generations. She is also scholar at the Cornell Smith Family Business Initiative, advisor at Lansberg Gersick & Associates and IFERA board member. She is a recipient of the 2012 FFI Best Unpublished Research Paper Award and a recipient of the 2015 *FBR* Best Article Award. In October, she will co-present the session "Ethical Dilemmas of Family Business Members and Their Advisors" at the FFI Global Conference.
